### **A Move of Historic Interest In Tubac**

The Tubac Historical Society recently moved into Tubac's landmark adobe Custom's House at 6 Burruel Street across from the Tubac Presidio Museum & State Park. Built in 1914, this historic adobe building is nestled in the heart of Tubac Village. According to Tubac Historical Society President, Andi Miritello: "Our new location is ideal to fulfill a critical part of our mission which is to support research on the history of Tubac and the Santa Cruz River Valley, preserve that history, and share it with the public." The Tubac Historical Society's research library collection includes extensive works on local history, books by local authors, oral history interviews, rare books and documents and genealogical references and records. In addition to housing these materials and collections, the new location offers a Visitor Center where you can purchase a large selection of books specific to southern Arizona history and culture, note cards, posters, reproductions and gifts. The Center will also showcase exhibits on local history, hold events, and support the community of Tubac as an active partner in Village life.
